- **Walking** - in Aberdeen city, everything is within easy reach, and Aberdeenshire offers countless scenic walks through countryside, forest and coast
- **Bus** - getting around Aberdeen and Aberdeenshire by bus is simple, affordable, and convenient. First Bus operates frequent services across the city, connecting shopping areas, attractions, and neighbourhoods. For travel beyond the city, Stagecoach runs reliable routes linking Aberdeen with towns and villages throughout Aberdeenshire
- **The Aberdeen Adventurer** - discover the best of Aberdeen City with the Aberdeen Adventurer, the ultimate hop-on, hop-off tour bus experience. Running from April to September, this convenient sightseeing bus takes you to the city's top attractions
- **Train** - Aberdeen Railway Station offers excellent local, regional, and national connections
- **Taxis** - Taxis, private hire vehicles and ride-hailing apps like Uber operate throughout the city and surrounding areas. Taxi ranks can be found at Union Square, Aberdeen Railway Station and Aberdeen International Airport



Bars with Interesting & Historical Architecture

Ma Cameron's

Ma Cameron's is one of Aberdeen's oldest pubs, dating back around 300 years, with its front room originally part of a coaching inn. It's known for cask ales, a rooftop beer garden, and a historic interior full of nooks and crannies.

Old Blackfriars

Old Blackfriars is a historic pub in Aberdeen's Merchant Quarter on Castle Street, set in a building dating back to the 17th century with low-beamed ceilings, stained glass and pews that lend an atmospheric feel. The cobbled pedestrian area outside once saw public executions and civic upheaval, giving the pub's location rich layers of city history to reflect on as you enjoy real ales and pub food.

Triplekirks

Triple Kirks is a popular pub in central Aberdeen, set in part of the historic Triple Kirks building, built in 1843 to house three churches under one spire. The striking spire remains, while the ground floor is now a lively bar.

St. Machar Bar

St. Machar Bar is a traditional pub in the historic Old Aberdeen area, housed in an 18th-century listed building on High Street and established as a drinking spot around 1904. It's become known for its extensive whisky selection and real ales, and is popular with university students, locals and visitors exploring the old campus quarter.

Areas around St. Machar Bar sit on gently sloping glacial deposits, which influenced early settlement patterns and where buildings and streets could be safely constructed.

The Grill

The Grill on Union Street is one of Aberdeen's oldest pubs, originally opened as a restaurant in 1870 and remodelled into a pub with its distinctive mahogany-panelled interior and ornate plasterwork in 1926. It's famous for its historic atmosphere, large selection of whiskies and ales, and long-standing place in the city's social scene, with the historic interior listed by CAMRA and a reputation as a classic whisky bar.

The Grill includes locally quarried granite and sandstone in walls or features.

The Archibald Simpson

The Archibald Simpson is a pub in Aberdeen's Castlegate area, named after the city's celebrated 19th-century architect Archibald Simpson, who also designed the building it occupies, the former North of Scotland Bank on Castle Street.

The grand granite structure with its Corinthian columns and classical details reflects Simpson's influence on Aberdeen's neoclassical architectural character.

Brewdog

BrewDog Castlegate is located in Aberdeen's historic Athenaeum building and offers views across Castlegate toward the Town House and Marischal College, two of the city's most notable architectural landmarks.

Soul

Soul is an award-winning bar and restaurant in Aberdeen's city centre, set inside the converted Langstane Kirk, a 19th-century B-listed church that still shows off its stained-glass windows and architectural character.

Slains

Slains is a distinctive pub and bar set inside a converted 19th-century church (formerly West St Nicholas Kirk) with a gothic-inspired atmosphere.

Under the Hammer

Under The Hammer is a basement pub on North Silver Street, named for its location beside the long-running John Milne Auctioneers, one of Aberdeen's oldest auction houses dating back to the late 19th century.

Krakatoa

Krakatoa is a long-standing rock bar, set within a Victorian-era building. It's often described as haunted, with staff and visitors reporting unexplained noises and sightings over the years.

City of Aberdeen Distillery

City of Aberdeen Distillery is located inside a historic railway arch (Arch 10), bringing distilling back to the city center after decades. It offers small-batch gin distilling, tours, tastings and a gin school experience in a unique industrial-heritage space beneath the railway.

Shiprow

Shiprow is one of Aberdeen's oldest streets, first mentioned in records in 1281 and originally serving as a key route between the harbour and the Castlegate area. Today it's a mix of historic sites like Provost Ross's House and the Aberdeen Maritime Museum, alongside a growing food and drink quarter known as Shiprow Village featuring independent bars.




